

# DZ-Manager™ POS-Mode / Self-Manifesting<sup>1</sup>

DZ-Manager™ includes a virtual **Manifest- / Clipboard** where skydivers can manifest themselves as well as remove them from a load and run reports to see jumps made and money spent in the past.



Even if the manifesters can move jumpers between loads at all times on their PCs, the POS<sup>1</sup>-Mode offers your customers to generally manage and monitor their skydiving time themselves.

Skydivers can just walk to a POS-Style PC<sup>2</sup> and scan their DzM-Card<sup>3</sup>. They will then be able to

- see the lifts they are manifested on
- select a lift they would like to be on
- take themselves of a lift
- see their current balance on the account

Using the **DZ-Manager™ POS-Mode** a skydiver can manifest himself in less than 10 seconds:

- Scan a DzM-Card
- Select “Next available life” or pick a lift from a list
- Confirm height

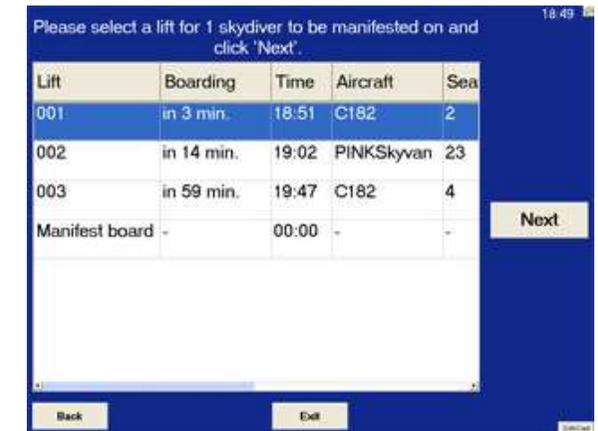
This also relieves your manifest from at least 60 % of the jumpers so they only have to deal with special cases like students and tandems.

Measuring has shown that it will save up to USD 20.000,00 of staff salary per season if jumpers manifest themselves. As a result a major US drop zone is able to offer jumpers a 10 % discount on all jumps manifested via **DZ-Manager™ POS-Mode**.

As an **example** this is how it works at the mentioned US drop zone:

1. Visit any of their touch screen monitors and place your DzM-Card over the RFID card reader holding it steady until your name appears in the upper left hand corner. If you are manifesting others in your group, continue to scan their cards until all of their names appear in the upper left hand corner.
2. Select next; choose which aircraft and load you would like to manifest yourself or group on. Make sure you look at the boarding

times and ensure you can make the load. Select the load.



3. Now select the altitude you wish to exit at 12,500 or 6,000. Remember, you will exit at the altitude you requested.
4. Once this is done you must confirm this selection within 20 seconds by pressing OK. If you fail to confirm your selection, you will not be placed on the load.
5. If you made an error / placed yourself on the wrong load you can rescan your card and make the appropriate changes. After the 10 minute call you can remove yourself from the load, but you will be charged for the slot.

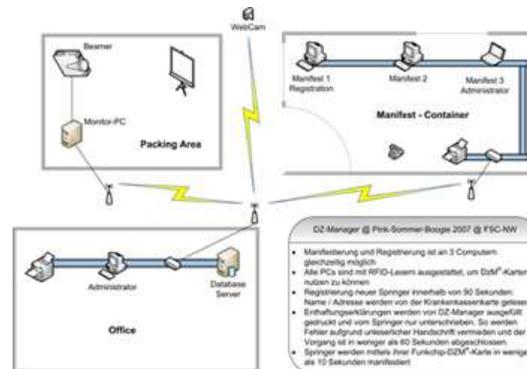


7. You must have funds on your account in order to use self-manifesting. You can place funds on your account with our main cashier or our above mentioned website. Your account balance will appear next to your name so you can determine when you need to place funds on your account. We do permit open accounts as long as you provide a valid credit card to be placed on your account details page.

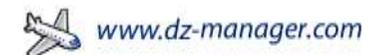
